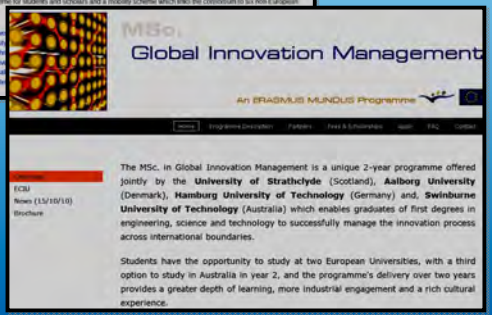

<p>Voices of the Students and Scholars</p> <p>Search site</p> <p>FAQ</p> <p>Login</p> <p>Contact Us</p>	<p>Deadlines and timetable</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The deadline for applicants, that want to apply for an Erasmus Mundus scholarship is 1 December of each year for the next cycle of the programme starting in fall of the following year. <p>Applications arriving by the deadline at the Global Studies office in Leipzig (address see below) will be automatically taken into consideration for the Erasmus Mundus grant. Therefore please send only one application to apply for the Master's course in Global Studies and the Erasmus Mundus scholarship.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> For applicants that do not want to apply for the Erasmus Mundus grant or that missed the above indicated deadline it is possible to apply by 30 June of each year for the next cycle of the programme starting in fall of the same year. <p>Meeting the application deadline will be established by the <u>date of arrival</u> of the hardcopy application at the Leipzig office.</p> <p>Approximately 3 weeks after your application has arrived in our offices you will receive a confirmation of receipt via e-mail. The final decision on the award of the Erasmus Mundus scholarship will be made in June only. The final decision on the admission to the programme for those students not being awarded an Erasmus Mundus grant will be announced at the latest by the end of July. How to Apply



- Application form (see below) including your home address, your date and place of birth, your e-mail address, your preferred mobility track (preference since final decision on the study places is made by the consortium)

- The application form for EU and non-EU students is the same.
- A Curriculum Vitae
 - Motivation letter which explains why you are interested in this particular Master course (1-2 pages)
 - Proof of nationality (copy of passport)
 - Certified copy or original hard copy (AND certified translation if the document is not issued in English/German or French) of high school leaving certificate (secondary school diploma)
 - Certified copy or original hard copy (AND certified translation if the document is not issued in English/German or French) of university diplomas; (if you graduate after the application deadline please send us the degree as soon as you receive it, the decision on the admission will in this case be made on the grades indicated on the transcript of records. Please note that in case of an admission the copy of your certified Bachelor's degree certificate will be needed in August in order to be able to enrol you.)
 - Certified copy or original hard copy (AND certified translation if the document is not issued in English/German or French) of official transcript of study results from your university
 - Certified copy or original hard copy of English test results. Applicants whose native language is not English must provide test scores for one of the following standardized English proficiency tests:
 - TOEFL (international), minimum score of 550 paper-based (or 213 computer-based or 80 internet-based). Please notice that the code number for the Master's course in Global Studies is: 4688
 - IELTS: minimum score of 6,5
 - CPE: Grades A, B, C (Certificate of Proficiency in English)
 - CAE: Grades A, B (Certificate in Advanced English)
 - Applicants who have studied for more than one year in, or received a degree from, a college or university where English is both the language of instruction and the native language are not requested to take one of the above mentioned proficiency test. An official certificate from the applicants' school/university is required to confirm that English is medium of instruction.
 - if applicable confirmation of command of Danish, German or/and Polish or any other European language other than the native language (e.g. confirmation of courses attended, tests passed)
 - Two recommendation letters by academic teachers or employers (in a separate envelope, sealed by the persons recommending the candidate) including the reference names and e-mail addresses
 - A passport size photo

Your application a.y. 2013-2014



- ➔ Deadline: mid November 2012 – mid February 2013
- ➔ Each individual EM Masters Course has its own deadline
- ➔ Pass the test of knowledge of a foreign language during summer
- ➔ Curriculum Vitae (model Europass)
- ➔ Motivation letter
- ➔ 2 reference letters
- ➔ Translation of your diploma or of transcript
- ➔ List of exams passed if you do not have yet the diploma
- ➔ Translation of your international passport (check the validity period)

It depends on the quality of your application



- ➔ Fill in carefully the application form: it takes time!
- ➔ Prepare all documents in advance: you will need to upload each of them when filling in the application form
- ➔ Your motivation letter is your entry ticket
- ➔ Reference letter from two professors are also important
- ➔ All documents must be in English or in any other foreign language (as requested)
- ➔ Keep the number you receive when applying
- ➔ Keep copy of all documents and application form

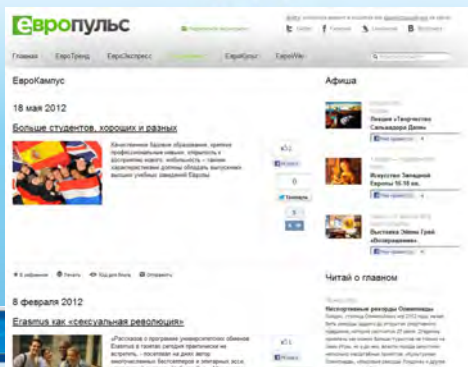

EU-Russia relations in the area of education have taken a steady expansion over the past couple of years. This is owing to the Fourth Common Space on Research, Education and Culture, signed at the Consulate General in Moscow in May 2005, which set out three main areas for cooperation:

- Encouraging closer co-operation in the area of non-formal education;
- Promoting the development of life skills education;
- Reinforcing the European Higher Education Area's reality, in accordance with the principles of the Bologna Process (see below).

These activities are carried through projects, measures and projects including facilitating links between Russian and European universities, introducing awards of premier quality, introducing quality monitoring systems for Russian universities and institutions, as well as several university quality-control systems; supporting Russian participation in the Erasmus Mundus programme; promoting Study in Russia (including training for government officials and post-graduate students) and the establishment of the European Studies Institute at MGIMO; and promoting the study of Russian and the Russian language in the EU, as well as the study of the EU and European languages in Russia.

The Bologna Process

The aim of the Bologna Process is to establish a Europe-wide framework for higher education that will have a real impact on the lives of European citizens. Individuals from participating countries will be able to move freely between higher education institutions, gain, transfer credits and courses. It will make learning more transparent, more adaptable to changing labour market demands, and to the requirements of higher education systems in other European countries. And it will speed the Bologna process in Russia.

The principles of the Bologna Process are: signed by European Commission Ministers in 2001, the Bologna Declaration, which:

- established a system of credit transfer and comparable degrees;
- adopted a three-year first cycle (undergraduate) programme;
- established a system of credits (such as ECTS);
- overcome obstacles to student/teacher mobility;
- promote European co-operation in quality assurance.
